Introduction

Universities work by enabling talented people to connect with one another so that they can collaborate and co-create new knowledge.

This simple premise is often made more complicated by the size and complexity of universities themselves, by an increasing focus on globalisation and by the emergence of new collaborative technologies.

In responding to the challenges posed by digital disruption and how to make change happen in complex environments, universities are therefore increasingly focusing on developing their collaborative leadership skills and capabilities, building on existing collaborative practices as well as developing new relationships which open up new collaborative possibilities.

Working in collaboration, the University of Nottingham together with the University of Birmingham have developed the *'Making Change Happen through Collaborative Working'* series of events which aims to equip senior and operational leaders across both universities with the tools, skills and insights to collaborate more effectively in an increasingly digital age.

These events are open to University of Nottingham and University of Birmingham staff only, and have been funded jointly by both institutions, so are free of charge to delegates.
